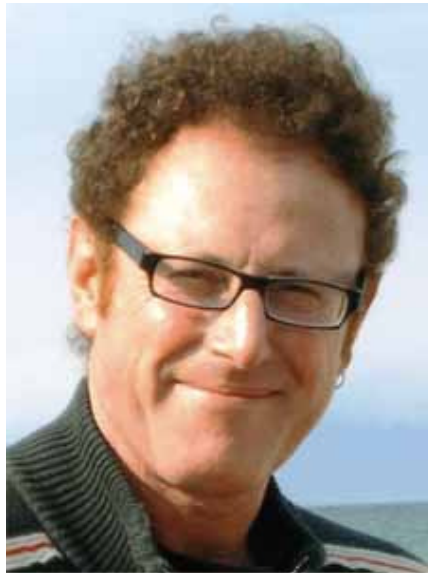

“Fidelity to Disagreement: Jacques Rancière and Politics without Ontology”

Benjamin Ardit is Professor of Politics at the National University of Mexico (UNAM). His latest book is *Politics on the Edges of Liberalism, Difference, Populism, Revolution, Agitation* (Edinburgh, 2007). He is editor of “Taking on the Political”, a book series on Continental political thought published by Edinburgh University Press. His recent work focuses on Occupy Wall Street, the Spanish *indignados*, the Mexican #YoSoy132 and other forms of viral politics and connectivity. This is part of his research on post-hegemony and post-liberal politics.
